Learn and Discuss:

The Fourth Article of Faith

The Fourth Article of Faith teaches us the "first principles and ordinances of the gospel" or the path to salvation. As the **Four**th Article of Faith, it has **four** main parts.





Repentance.

When we sin, we turn away from God. Repentance is turning back to Him. When we feel bad about something we did wrong, we can repent and ask God for forgiveness. Through the power of Jesus Christ, we can be healed.



Faith in Jesus Christ.

Faith is believing in something we can't see. We may not physically see Jesus, but with faith, we can know He is there. Faith in Christ is something we can exercise to grow stronger. Even a small amount of faith is powerful!

Discussion questions:

- Ask a parent or teacher to share when they have exercised faith.
- How can you strengthen your faith?
